







GENEROSITY OF CARE

(CARE/COUNSELING)

We sat in hospitals with the broken-hearted. We wept with those who wept. Because of your involvement at Grace Road this year, we were able to offer a hand of hope to those who felt they had none left at all. At Grace Road, we don't pretend to have it all together. Because of that, people with real struggles felt like this was a safe space to seek help. We were able to provide care and counseling, and cover the costs for people to see other mental health professionals with the hope of alleviating the weight that they carried in both their head and their heart.





Meeting with Carl has helped me immensely. It's so tempting to get caught up in our own schedules and agendas and write God out at times. The care ministry has given me practical advice and applications for my day to day life. SERMONS SERIES

We began 2017 with an 11-week study of the book of Philippians. Topics included Christ's obedience, humility, faith and works, and legalism. From there we moved on to the book of Jonah for 7 weeks. In that series, we talked about sin, grace, evangelism, repentance, bitterness, and God's love for prodigals. Over the summer we had guest speakers from around the world, many of whom are supported by Grace Road in their various missionary endeavors. At the end of the summer, we had a 2 week series titled "Water. Bread & Wine" and spent 2 weeks in Luke 24:13-25. That series showed us that Jesus does not desire to be known through the eyes but most commonly through the word, the Lord's Supper, and Baptism. In the fall, we started what we expect to be a year-long journey through the greatest letter ever written: Romans. Topics so far have included God's wrath, faith, religion, hope, peace, joy, and love.

In 2017 we launched a video ministry in an attempt to serve the body in more unique ways. Sunday sermons are now recorded and available online and through our app. Additionally, we've been able to produce personal testimonies of church members to share to the body on Sundays.

This year we also launched a video service for the ASL community. Each week, we record the ASL interpretation and this video is offered for those who need this resource.



CONCLUSION

When Grace Road started meeting in 2009, we never imagined that we were part of such a big story of God's grace in Rochester. Just a handful of people showed up for our first Easter service in the Dietrich's house, and we wondered if there would be any story told at all. But God has been incredibly gracious. Despite all that we've gotten wrong, all the mis-steps, and all of the crazy interruptions to the mission over the years, God has blessed and grown our church. Men and women have come to know Christ. We've become a church where recovering religionists and recovering drug addicts are worshipping Christ side-by-side. Christ is known and is being made known. We couldn't have asked for more.

In 2017, our expansion of the staff started to bear fruit. We are now doing more counseling, discipling, teen ministry, kid's ministry, and women's ministry than ever before, all within a church that is more organized than ever. Our safety team has grown and is thriving in its continued mission to help our gatherings run smoothly. Our men's conference was a success, encouraging and strengthening men from not only our church but area churches as well. This summer we introduced our church to many of our missionaries, increasing church awareness of all we do "out there." The strength of the staff has enabled me to spend more time on sermon preparation, resource development, and helping Acts 29 in our mission to plant churches.

It is also encouraging to see that we were able to give away far more money this year than ever before. We gave more to help plant churches this year than we had in total offerings just 8 years ago. We gave almost twice as much as in any previous year to help the poor in our congregation. We quietly helped people with rent, medicine, transportation, and even bought some Christmas gifts for a needy family. Our Christmas offering provided over \$15,000 to support 441 Ministries. We were able to support the Open Door Mission, FCA, Cru, and other ministries in town.

At the end of 2017, our elders approved our plans for next year which include doubling what we gave to church planting in 2017. We have plans to begin the core phase of a second location of Grace Road Church in 2018. Our surplus funds from the previous year and ongoing generosity will help us multiply, rather than simply grow bigger in one location.

Our biggest desire for this church is that Jesus' name would be made great throughout our region. We want everyone to know the Gospel message and to have repeated encounters with people who believe it. We want to see all of our members view their neighborhoods, campuses, workplaces, schools, and families as the primary fields where the Gospel can be spread and where neighbors can be served in love. In the years ahead, we are working to see Grace Road multiply into a network of local churches that embody the same Gospel and the same DNA, but that are uniquely positioned to reach their communities.
