Aletter from Kevin

2023 flew by. This year, Grace Road was blessed in some ways we never could have predicted.



More people professed a new faith in Christ this year than I can remember. We heard story after story of people coming to believe and follow Jesus. We saw it demonstrated in dozens of baptisms, we heard about God's work in lives through our Advent testimony videos, and it was a thrill to have front-row seats in observing God's grace to us.

This year, we saw a big surge in people serving to help local ministries, more prayers for our missions endeavors, and some gave months of their lives to overseas missions work. God has also blessed with new additions to our staff and eldership. The continued growth of our church required us to convert one

of our last remaining spaces into a kids classroom and a few world-class volunteers converted some closet space into offices, so nearly every inch of our facility is now being used. Our giving exceeded our budget, we remained debt-free, and we gave away more resources to missions, ministries, and church-planting than ever before.

We, of course, also experienced some setbacks and disappointments. We had hoped to convert a large basement space to a classroom, but water and other issues have made that impractical for now. Great members of our church moved away and other key leaders experienced tragedies and sickness in their families. Some of our members went on to be with the Lord: a loss for us but a gain for them. In any given year, a church's life will be characterized by being "sorrowful, yet always rejoicing (2 Cor. 6:10)," and 2023 was no exception.

Introduction

In 2024, we are facing many great opportunities, as well as key challenges. We have an opportunity to expand our staff and ministries, to further increase our giving toward missions, take our first large-scale missions trips (to El Salvador and perhaps Scotland), and support new ministries (like the Seed Company, a Bible translation endeavor that is affiliated with Wycliffe). We also face real challenges: a facility that is full, some leaders that are tired, and leadership structures straining under the weight of such a large and fast-moving church.

Our hope in 2024 is to overhaul a couple of our top-level leadership structures and systems, solidify and expand our eldership, and elaborate on our ministry philosophy so that we can do a better job leading the church and providing pastoral care. With some help from the outside, we hope to fortify Grace Road's operations for the church and leaders alike, simplify our organization, and clarify to our members how community, care, service, and mission work together at Grace Road.

On the personal side of things, our family is doing well. The kids are all following the Lord and love Grace Road. Lydia is a sophomore in college at Grove City where she is an R.A. and involved in her church, in Younglife, and too many other things to list. Sophia is finishing her senior year of high school with an eye toward nursing in the future. Isabelle is a sophomore and loves serving in missions. And Hudson is a freshman, with a number of options for his future. They all serve in the kids ministry and all four will be





Missions

Grow Groups

In 2023, our men's and women's Grow Groups met for 36 weeks to study Life Together by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the book of Isaiah, a study on Repentance, and Delighting in the Trinity by Michael Reeves. Groups of men and women around the area met weekly to pray, memorize scripture, serve the local church, confess sin, and study the Scriptures together.

"Our group has been meeting for some time and it has been really beautiful to see the growth of the lives of our members. It can take a long time for guys to open up, but this feels like proof that if we are open to the work of the Spirit and are willing to be faithful, God will bring the growth. During a recent meeting, one of our members said, "I have been a Christian for 39 years but have never confessed sins to another person. In this group, I finally feel I can." There's nothing magical about getting a group of guys together but there is something so miraculous about the God's work in the hearts of sinners who know they have been saved by grace."

"Ever since I joined my Grow Group in 2020, I'm always eager to share with people about how it has changed my life. It has been one of my greatest life blessings.

The three and a half years leading up to Grow Group were full of isolation and trial for my family. Although I was full of fear and anxiety, I knew I needed to join some type of Gospelcentered community. When I looked up the groups, I saw a familiar leader name pop up, (Nicole Dumas)!

I reached out to her and asked if her group was open, and she immediately replied yes with excitement. I remember the first night driving to grow group being scared to death and asking myself "What on earth am I doing!?" I was terrified to walk into her house. The thoughts that ran through my

mind were "Will I fit in?" "Will I ever feel comfortable with this group of ladies?" and "I'll never be able to memorize scripture!" Fears and doubts ran through my head. As soon as I walked in the door, I was surrounded by warm smiles and open arms. In all my life, I have never felt so much unconditional love and support. Whenever there is a need, the group is there for one another, praying and providing any tangible needs. I have never seen the gospel lived out so clearly in a group before.

Group has also deepened my faith in many ways. Group has provided the accountability I need to be in the Word each day. My eyes have been opened and understanding deepened to the indescribable love and compassion that Christ Jesus has for us. The beauty and richness of the gospel has become even more real to me. When I walk into church on Sunday mornings now, I see familiar faces and feel more connected to the church. And that's because of Grow Group! I am really thankful for this.

Our prayer is that this ministry will help midlifers know they aren't alone and enable them to relate to others through the new experiences that come in this season of life. May we embolden and challenge one another to be strong in the Lord and serve Him always.



Young Adults:

In 2023, GRYA continued to connect young adults at Grace Road with each other and the church for a second year! The group hosted ten events that included a bonfire worship night, picnic, trivia, and a BBQ Friendsgiving, all with intentionality for connection and community building. This year, GRYA has connected at least 200 young adults! We have been encouraged by the increased community, building of relationships, and development of mentorship; both broadly and through specific events.

One of the GRYA Leadership Team Members shared:

"I was searching for community in the Summer of 2022, and didn't know anyone for the first few weeks I was here. Then, we had 'Dipsgiving' in the Fall of 2022. A year later, I'm completely plugged in throughout the church, and involved in GRYA. This year was another encouraging one for our Grace Groups. Each year, we seek to expand options to enable more people in our church to live in fellowship and community. In 2023, the Grace Road Institute offered classes on Biblical Theology, Hermeneutics, Global Missions, and Systematic Theology. Nearly 200 people participated in these courses. We also completed the inaugural year of the new Saints & Scholars program, a 29-week class designed for more advanced theological study in the context of the local church community. Looking back on his time of theological study in the program, one student noted, "It feels as though a small crack in a door has revealed an awe-inspiring room that I want to have opened even if just a little more." 26 students have signed up to dive deeper in the 2023-2034 Saints & Scholars program. Our hope is that the Grace Road Institute continues to serve the church by offering accessible theological and biblical education for years to come. Join us in a future class!



Volunteers + Sundays

2023 has brought many new faces to our Sunday morning volunteer teams, including Hospitality (coffee), Greeting, Ushers, Safety, Parking, Communion, Set Up, and Tear Down. With a little over 200 volunteers total, about 30-40 serve each Sunday to help people feel welcomed, known, and cared for. It's encouraging to watch each person who comes into the building be greeted with a smile and a cup of coffee.



Additionally, we know that another location or church plant is likely in our future. By reserving savings when possible, we can approach future church planting with flexibility and plant without taking on excessive debt.


Our Facility budget includes a savings for major repairs and improvements on our current facility.


We loved seeing so many faces, old and new, gathered again for the conference. We're already counting down the days to the next one in 2025!





In Memoriam

In Memoriam Jaime Josef Soley, Jr.



May 19, 2000 - August 6th, 2023

Jaime Josef Soley, Jr.

Jaime lived a unique and remarkable life. He loved coming to church. He loved the music, but perhaps he could take or leave the sermon. (The family remembers a time he yelled out "lunch" right in the middle of the sermon - which is probably what everybody else there was thinking as well.) Suddenly this past August, he went to sleep, and awoke in the presence of Jesus.

He loved the Lord, He loved to worship, he loved family, and certainly loved food.

While he was here, he loved going for walks with his dad and his dog, doing puzzles, watching movies, and singing praise music.

In Memoriam

It's a huge comfort to know that so many of the things he loved are his in overflowing measure today: He can worship and sing in the presence of Jesus, seeing him face to face.

The time of reunion with the Lord is repeatedly described as a time of feasting and joy.

But beyond all the externals, he personally knows the love and glory of Jesus.

So there is much to be thankful for. We are thankful for the 23 years we had with Jaime and all the people he brought joy to: His parents and sisters loved him and built their lives around Jaime and some of his needs, but they did so without a sense of burden because of the happiness Jaime brought to them.

He had many caretakers who spent 40 hours per week with him since he was two years old, and they grew to enjoy and love Jaime over the years. Jaime liked order and routine, so his waitresses came to know him and know his exact order.

Jaime loved to see his friend Justin at church. Everybody who knew Jamie came to like him because he uniquely approached all of his relationships without any jealousy or anger.

His parents instilled two key values in him: love and respect. And he took those to heart and applied them in his life.

And when we lose someone like Jaime, it's easy for us to feel completely disoriented - like one of our guiding lights isn't around anymore.

But there's a good place to anchor our hearts: In Christ, in the resurrection promised for all who believe, and the good future we have with Jesus and with Jaime, when we see Christ face-to-face.
